About ninety-nine times out of a hundred the sound [t] is spelled either <tt> or <t>.

Examples

Words that have the sound [t] spelled <t>:

tree painter craft container taxi

Words that have the sound [t] spelled <tt>:

tattle brunette flattest cottage unbutton
